Lawyers are essential to uphold the rule of law and ensure access to justice, including by defending individuals who may be victims of human rights violations. Under the Convention, states must ensure that lawyers can carry out their professional duties without being the target of any form of physical attack, threat, harassment, intimidation or any improper hindrance or interference.
